January Cursillo Report

Summary of the SOL—In January, the SoL was COMBINED and held in Cullman at Sacred Heart Catholic Church from 9:30-11-30am. The doctrine talk was given by Fr. Pat Egan, OSB, pastor of Sacred Heart parish, and the technique talk covered the three day encounter known as the Cursillo de Cursillo. Additional announcements concerning the movement are:

Cursillo Methodology— "The 'Work of the Sections' is important to ensure that all parts of the Cursillo process are active and functioning within the larger movement. No one section should be given precedence over the other two sections. Neither can any section be treated with less integrity than the other two sections. To thoroughly understand the Cursillo Movement, one must understand that it is comprised of three equally important phases. To injure any one phase injures the entire Movement." (*Leaders Manual, U.S. Catholic Cursillo Movement, p. 62*).
