

- † Some men, with the help of science and financial support have been able to go from the exterior of man to the surface of the moon. Extraordinary Jubilee of
Mercy



Divine Mercy and Forgiveness



- † The Pope has written and is releasing the publication of the Bull of Indiction, "Misericordiae vultus".
- † To express his wish that the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy will be celebrated in Rome and throughout the world, Pope Francis will consign a copy of the Bull, to present it symbolically to all bishops,



Divine Mercy and Forgiveness



† Pope Francis wrote the publication of the *Bull of Indiction*, "Misericordiae vultus". The Jubilee Bull, aside from indicating the duration, opening and closing dates, and the main ways in which the Holy Year will unfold, constitutes the basic document for understanding the spirit in which it was convoked, as well as Pope Francis' intentions and the fruit he hopes the Year will bear.



Divine Mercy Revelation





- † St. Maria Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938), the Lord's "secretary of Divine Mercy."
- † In the 1930s, St. Maria
 Faustina Kowalska, a young,
 uneducated nun, received
 extraordinary revelations
 from our Lord Jesus
 regarding God's loving
 message of Divine Mercy.



Divine Mercy Chaplet



- * "On this day the very depths of My tender mercy are open; I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who will approach the fount of My mercy on this day. On this day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Therefore, Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet" (Diary 699)
- † "Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world."
- † "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."



The Meaning of the Day



- † Clearly, Divine Mercy Sunday is not a new feast established to celebrate St. Faustina's revelations. Indeed, it is not *primarily* about St. Faustina at all nor is it altogether a *new* feast!
- † As many commentators have pointed out, The Second Sunday of Easter was already a solemnity as the Octave Day of Easter; nevertheless, the title "Divine Mercy Sunday" does highlight and amplify the meaning of the day. In this way, it recovers an ancient liturgical tradition, reflected in a teaching attributed to St. Augustine about the Easter Octave, which he called "the days of mercy and pardon," and the Octave Day itself "the compendium of the days of mercy."



His Merciful Heart



† The Divine Mercy Devotion

- † Devotion to The Divine Mercy involves a total commitment to God as Mercy. It is a decision to trust completely in Him, to accept His mercy with thanksgiving, and to be merciful as He is merciful.
- † There are two scriptural verses that we should keep in mind as we involve ourselves in these devotional practices:
- † 1. "This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me" (Isaiah 29:13);
- † 2. Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy"
 - (Matthew 5:7).



Divine Mercy and Forgiveness



- † The devotional practices revealed through Saint Faustina were given to us for us to become as "vessels of mercy" through which God's love can be poured out upon the world, but they are not sufficient unto themselves.
- † It's not enough for us to hang The Divine Mercy image in our homes, pray the Chaplet every day at three o'clock, and go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the first Sunday after Easter.
- † We also have to show mercy to our neighbors. Putting mercy into action is not an option of the Divine Mercy Devotion; it's a requirement!
