- **†** SUMMARY of Part 1 from Last Month's SOL
- To be a Christian leader is a call from God that He makes to you at baptism.
- The affirmative response to this call seals a commitment to remain always in pursuit of making all of mankind live according to Christian principles.
- It is a commitment to be an example of what we preach. In Christian talk,
 "the call to leadership is a call to put oneself at the service of everyone else."
- In order to be able to discern this call, we must have hope, dedication and charity.
- + But above all: We must have **Tons of HUMILITY**.
- And serve with humility and promptness without expecting a reward, praise, or some type of recognition.





+ Last month we talked about the natural qualities that a leader must possess, which are:

Discipline, Friendship, Initiative, and Generosity.

- In order to succeed in the apostolic field, it is essential for a person to put his/her personality and qualities at the service of the Lord.
- A Christian leader is one who is always united to the criterion of Christ and strengthens it through prayer and sacrifice.

† Today's leaders must have: Living Faith

- † This does not mean to believe blindly, but is a part of our daily, normal, everyday life. When we incorporate the divine power of the Lord in our circumstances, we can feel Him present by our side at every moment – that is Living Faith.
- In whatever we are doing, <u>it is knowing that Christ and I are an overwhelming</u> <u>majority!</u>
- + Jesus Himself tells us that we must have Faith the size of a mustard seed, and with that Faith, we will make the mountains move using Jesus' power.
- Living the faith in this way is doing everything on our part to be useful instruments in the hands of the Lord to bring about change in our environments.





† Today's leaders must have: Humility

- * "HUMILITY is a firm basis for all other virtues. We can be or do all the good things that we want, but if we don't have humility, everything is useless."
- We must not confuse humility with weakness or use it as our laziness in not doing something important. In fact the lack of action is a lack of holy audacity (holy boldness).
- The humble person recognizes that everything comes from God and accepts the responsibility to use the gifts the Lord gives him/her.
- + Humility allows us to recognize each one of our talents and their value, and allows us to place them at the service of God and our brothers and sisters.
- + Humility recognizes the talents of others without jealousy.
- Humility is not self-humiliation, let me explain, it is not to publicly degrade oneself, sometimes we tell ourselves that we are inferior to others and we have a very low opinion about our abilities. On the contrary, the humble person recognizes that each one has a special talent, a style that is exclusively his.





† Today's leaders must have: Hope

- HOPE is the virtue that begins when all human hope ends. Hope is to believe in the impossible and to live as if it were a reality.
- ⁺ Having the virtue of hope, we make things possible and overcome discouragement. It is not about sitting down and waiting for the miracle to happen, but to wait for it by making a path for the miracle. We must work as if everything depended on us, and pray as if everything depended on God. "Jesus, I trust in You."
- Reflect on you past life experiences, has the Lord given you a wakeup call?
 Does he prompt you? If you think back, you may realize that He always
 puts you where He considers that you should be, no matter the place,
 time or situation.





+ Today's leaders must have: Love

- + Many believe that love is giving material goods or hugs to each other. But love is so much more.
- Supernatural Love is to give oneself entirely to others through <u>selfless service</u>. It is the only true dimension of what is apostolic.
- + God is Love. Jesus is Love. We are to be Christ-like, so we too must love our neighbor.
- We cannot do it alone; we need Christ and the support of our brothers to be able to persevere in our daily living. We can find the love that we are looking for in our Friendship Groups, the Ultreya, School of Leaders, the Mass, the Apostolic Hour, etc.
- The best and largest demonstration of love towards others is to ensure they live in Grace.
 Love them enough to help their soul and direct them to a better life after death. <u>Third leg of the tripod Evangelization-Action</u>
- + Living in community, helping each other in our walk through life is **our fourth day.**





- All these supernatural qualities should be directed to develop all the potential of our baptism and therefore to have the joy and the good taste of wanting to be holy.
- All these qualities have to be applied harmoniously in order to produce good fruit.
- In summary: In order to succeed as a Christian leader in the apostolic field, it is essential for a person to put his/her personality and qualities at the service of the Lord. We are His hands and feet and eyes.
